Linux Foundation ID (LFID)

Linux Foundation ID (LFID) is a free account that identifies you and securely provides access to web sites of The Linux Foundation, our projects, and our service providers.

First steps for a new chair (and new group)



Schedule

Please work with the community to find the best time for a call. Consider various geographies. You can schedule it once a week or once every two weeks.





Introduce

Send a welcome email to the group and encourage everyone to introduce themselves. Remember that people feel more collaborative when they know whom they're working with



Facilitate

Facilitate discussion on the mailing list and chat. Make sure everyone is signed up and do not have technical barriers to participate.



Create

Create content to be published on the wiki, make sure you have access to the community folder and other required resources



*Since a single Zoom account allows multiple IDs, but only one meeting can occur at the same time, ensure that the meeting day/time does not conflict with an existing community meeting.

Ongoing responsibilities



Distribute

Prior to every call distribute an agenda. Make sure that minutes are being taken (Find a scribe!). If a meeting is cancelled, make sure participants know 24-48h in advance.



Update

Ensure that working group updates and SIG updates are prepared every quarter and put on the wiki along with sending it to your Staff POC (if applicable)



Lead

Lead the discussions, making sure everyone is being heard and have an opportunity to express their views. You are the air traffic controller, not the Chief in Command.

Ongoing responsibilities (detailed)

- Facilitating the group and helping ensure that the mission statement and goals are observed and met
- Scheduling and facilitating regular General Meetings open to all XX-WG/SIG/Chapter membership
- Developing and distributing meeting agendas *at least* one business day before the scheduled meeting across the group's communication channels (mailing list, chat, etc.)
- Ensuring that all group members have the opportunity to participate in decisions and provide input even when not attending a meeting. WG/SIG/Chapter communities are global and a chair should make efforts to ensure all are included in the community's activities. This can be done by ensuring meeting notes are shared after calls and any major decisions are shared on the mailing list.
- Ensure recordings/minutes are taken during meetings which captures the discussion and includes a list of meeting participants, shared post meeting, and are added to the WG/SIG/Chapter wiki page
- Manage the WG/SIG/Chapter wiki page
- Generate Special Interest Group Quarterly Updates to present to Hyperledger POC in a timely manner and communicate regularly on any concerns or questions related to the WG/SIG/Chapter
- Serving as a proxy and ambassador for WG/SIG/Chapter membership (as appropriate)
- Enforcing adherence to the <u>Hyperledger Code of Conduct</u> and communicating the Anti-Trust Policy



Running a Meeting

- → 2-5 days before meeting: Start an agenda and invite group to add to agenda on wiki
- Ensure that call reminder goes out 1 day before meeting (and that it is correct)
- → Send a reminder for the call 1 hour prior (optional, but sometimes helps with attendance)
- → Launch the zoom at meeting time and enable recording by going to Participants>Claim Host>Enter zoom code (Host key: 475869) >Record. See which code applies to your zoom meeting link here.
- → Display the Antitrust policy and Code of Conduct at the start of the recording.



Running a Meeting

- → Continue the call following the agenda and identify someone to take notes.

 Please try to invite people to participate and speak. Sometimes there are voices that can dominate and it's important to give space to everyone to participate.
- → When the meeting ends, you may be prompted on where to save the recording or it just saves automatically on your computer, do a search for "zoom" on your computer and you will usually find where it's located.



After each Meeting

- → Upload the recording to the wiki page with notes
- → Send a recap email to the mailing list with meeting notes and pointing to the recording as well as any follow up to the discussion.
- → Any changes to the meeting day or time must be communicated on the mailing list and adjusted on the lists.hyperledger.org calendar at a minimum 24 hrs before.



Community Group Promotion

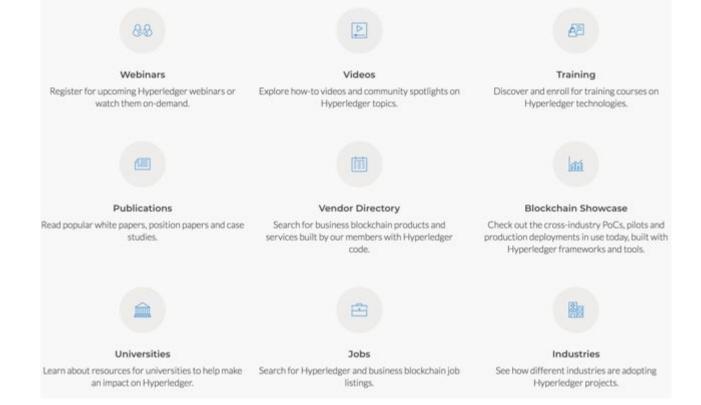
